

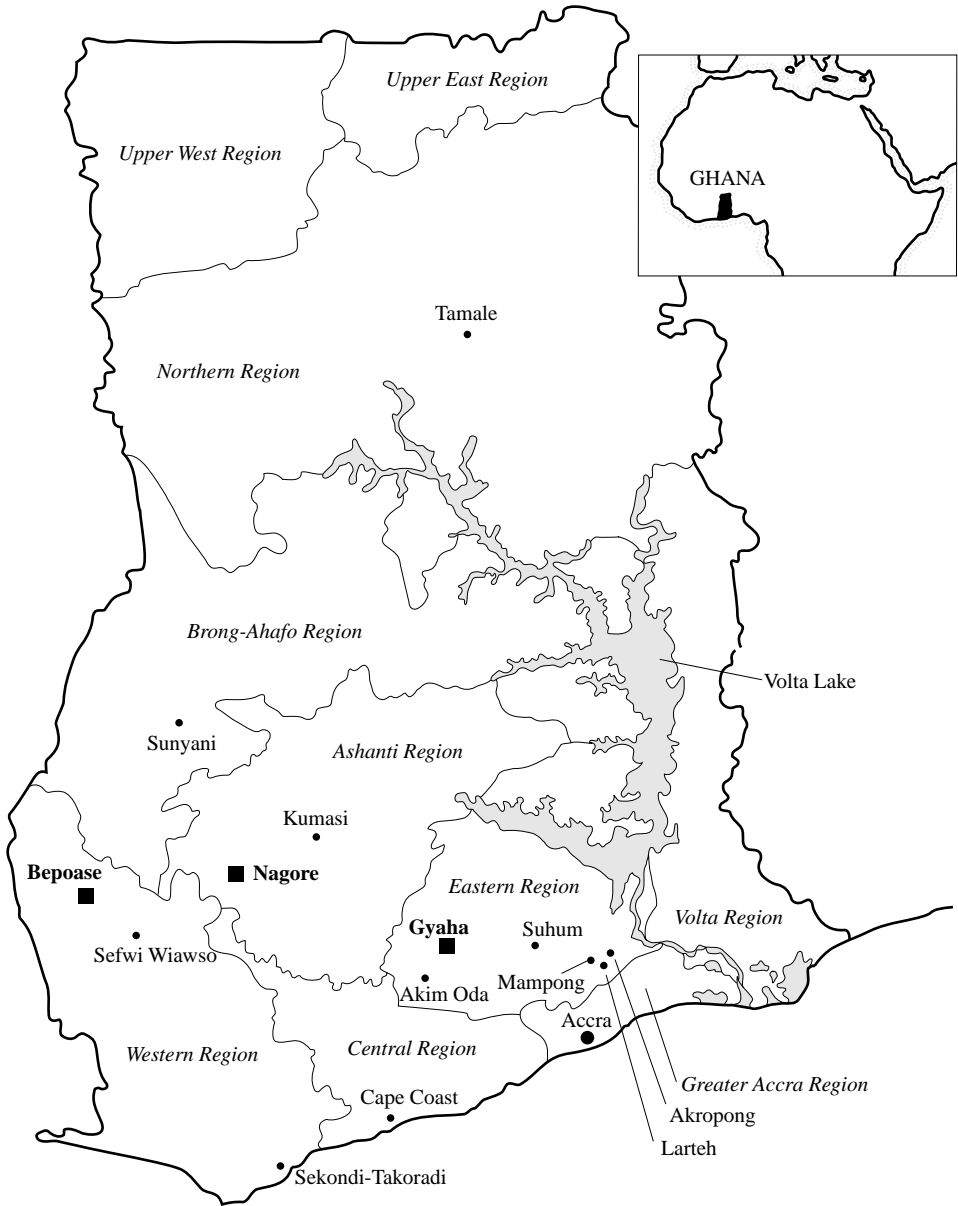

Remarks

- (1) During the period of fieldwork from 1995 to 1997, the value of the Ghanaian currency (cedi) was between 1,300 and 1,700 cedis per U.S. dollar.
- (2) Common nouns in the Akan language are italicized in the text. As this book has little to say about the Akan language, anglicized forms seen in most of the literature on Ghana are used. Thus, no distinctions are made between “e” and “ɛ,” and “o” and “ɔ.”
- (3) All the names of the farmers have been changed to protect their anonymity.
