

The aim of the Institute of Developing Economies (Ajia Keizai Kenkyusho) is to conduct basic and comprehensive research on economic and related affairs in Asia and other areas which are on the road to development. It, thereby, contributes to the promotion of economic cooperation and the improvement of trade relations between Japan and these areas and, ultimately, toward the prosperity and welfare of developing countries.

The Institute was founded in December 1958 as a nonprofit organization. In July 1960, it was recognized by law as a semi-governmental body. The Institute merged with JETRO on July 1, 1998 to strengthen trade and economic cooperation with the Asia Pacific and other regions.

As of March 1, 2000, the number of staff members was 252, of whom about two-thirds are engaged in research (including 30 stationed overseas), with the rest employed as librarians, statisticians, or secretarial personnel.


